Dr. Margaret Darrow, P.E., PhD

Dr. Margaret Darrow is a geological engineer, a professor in the Civil, Geological, and Environmental Engineering department at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, and a registered Civil (Geotechnical) Engineer in the State of Alaska. She collected degrees like some people collect stamps (only hers are bigger on the wall and cost more), obtaining degrees in geology, geological engineering, and Arctic engineering. Her research centers on frozen ground engineering, with projects investigating unfrozen water content in frozen soils, slope stability in permafrost, thermal modeling of infrastructure over permafrost, and the performance of geotechnical instrumentation in frozen ground.
