"Rock Engineering: Foundations and Rock Slopes, Design Overview with Alaskan Examples"

Bedrock implies stability, and something described as rock solid doesn't move. In most cases, rock lives up to its reputation, but for many rock slopes, natural or excavated, there can be serious instability that impacts life safety or increased costs. For large, heavy structures founded on rock, particularly those associated with rock slopes such as bridges or dams, rock can present serious design challenges. We'll cover a brief introduction to rock engineering practice and concepts, geological methods and tools, and the engineering application on a couple Alaskan projects.


