TOPIC

ASCE Historic Civil Engineering Landmark Dedications

For the past decade the ASCE Alaska Section has been working toward recognizing the Salmon Creek Dam and the O'Connell Bridge as Historic Civil Engineering Landmarks. The Salmon Creek Dam was constructed in 1912 in Juneau. This was the first constant angle concrete arch dam in the country and was dedicated as a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark. The O'Connell Bridge was constructed in 1972 in Sitka. This was the first vehicular cable-stayed bridge in Alaska and one of the earliest in the nation, that serves as an essential connection for the community. The O'Connell Bridge was dedicated as a State Historic Civil Engineering Landmark. These dedications were held in Juneau and Sitka the weekend of September, 10th 2022.
